

Choosing a memorial



After the funeral you may decide that you would like to create a memorial as a way of remembering the person who has died. There are many kinds of memorial, from traditional churchyard headstones to sundials, trees and benches. Because a memorial will last, we recommend that you take time - there is no need at all to rush.

When you choose a memorial, think about the way you would like to remember your loved one in years to come.

- You can plant a tree that will live for generations.
- A stone memorial marks your loved one's grave in the cemetery, churchyard or crematorium.
- You can create a plaque for a crematorium or house wall.
- Many families place a bench in a place their loved one used to visit.
- A sculpture can be an object of beauty as well as of remembrance.
- You can write about your loved one, for example in our memorial hall.
- You can set up a trust in your loved one's name to remember them and fund a charity that mattered to them.

If you create a public memorial such as a gravestone or bench, you will need to comply with regulations which can be quite complicated, but your local Funeral Partners funeral director can help you.
